Wilson's Phalarope is no ordinary shorebird. Unlike many birds, the females are the flashy ones, and they chase the males instead of the other way around. The males do all the work of hatching the eggs and caring for the chicks. These birds also have a fun way of eating: they spin in circles on the water to stir up food. They travel huge distances from North America to South America, gathering in big flocks on salt lakes. But their wetlands are disappearing, making it harder for them to find food and rest, which is why we need to protects these habitats.
